U.N. New York Briefing on Nagoya Biodiversity Summit

On 1 November, the CBD Executive Secretary travelled to New York and presented to the Second committee of the United Nations General Assembly the successful outcomes of the COP-MOP 5 and the COP10 meetings. A briefing was also made to representatives of the Permanent Missions to the United Nations in New York. Also on the same day, a press conference on the ABS Protocol to Convention on Biological Diversity was also held. A breakfast briefing, hosted by the U.K. Permanent Representative, was held at the U.K. Mission, with the participation of more than 25 Permanent Representatives to the U.N. Meetings were also held with senior U.N. officials, as well as representatives of Permanent Missions to the U.N. in New York. 39th GEF Council Meeting Washington, D.C., U.S.A

The thirty-ninth meeting of the Council of the Global Environment Facility was held from 16-18 November 2010 in Washington, D.C., United States of America. The GEF Council noted the success of the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties, and discussed the proposal of a Japanese ABS Trust Fund to support a multilateral benefit sharing mechanism and technology transfer as well as the request for establishing a South-South Biodiversity Fund. The Council agreed that the GEF shall launch a pilot on accrediting new agencies under Paragraph 28 of the Instrument, and priority shall be given to the accreditation of national institutions. The CBD Execu-



tive Secretary also met with senior staff from The World Bank, as well as from the Global Environment Facility, among others.

A Table from the Sea's Edge

During the Nagoya Biodiversity Summit, a large table and chairs created by British furniture-maker and artist Silas Birtwistle, gained great attention from the delegates. Crafted from driftwood, the striking artwork was unveiled to the public for the first time and was exhibited in the courtyard of the Nagoya Congress Center throughout the conference. The project is supported by the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity, WWF, the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) and the shipping line Maersk, as well as numerous other organizations. FSC will be using the artwork as a centerpiece of its communications during the 2011 International Year of Forests and aim to take it to a number of cities around the world. The next port of call for the Table from the Sea's Edge will be Liverpool, U.K., where it will be exhibited at the city's World Museum. Plans



are also under way for its exhibition and use at other international gatherings early in the New Year, including the 2011 annual meeting of the World Economic Forum in Davos-Klosters, Switzerland

The meeting was attended by 51 participants, from 17 Arab countries and 14 regional and international organizations, and agreed to a 16-point Arab regional statement for action on the 2020 biodiversity targets, funding strategies and innovative financial mechanisms in response to the Aichi Target, which will be implemented by the Arab region with support from regional and international organizations.
