

NOTIFICATION

Second meeting of the Ad Hoc Technical Expert Group Meeting on dry and sub-humid lands

Montreal, Canada, 23 - 27 September 2002

The decision to establish this Expert Group was taken by the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity in adopting the programme of work on dryland, Mediterranean, arid, semi-arid, grassland, and savannah ecosystems, also referred to as programme of work on "dry and sub-humid lands", at its fifth meeting (decision V/23, annex), in order to assist the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA) in its work on the topic of dry and sub-humid lands with the following tasks:

- Consolidate and assess information on the status and trends of biodiversity of dry and sub-humid lands;
- Possible establishment of an international network of dry and sub-humid areas of particular value for biodiversity;
- Indicators of the status and trends of biological diversity; monitoring and early warning systems;
- Processes affecting biodiversity;
- Global benefits derived from biodiversity and valuation of biodiversity;
- Socio-economic impacts of its loss, including the interrelationship between biodiversity and poverty;
- Measures taken for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity (including the role of ex-situ conservation, resource management and preventive measures);
- Measures taken for the support of sustainable livelihoods;
- Consideration of capacity development, and the need of some Parties for assistance in seeking resources to develop proposals;
- Assessment of international priorities set up at the regional and global levels; and
- Proposals for expected outcomes, further activities, possible actors that may implement them, and timetables for action.

The recent decision (VI/4) adopted at the sixth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (held in April 2002) requested the Secretariat to prepare a proposal for the development of a mechanism to coordinate activities in the area of biodiversity,

desertification/land degradation and climate change, and for linking and ensuring integration of the national biodiversity strategies and action plans under the Convention on Biological Diversity and the national action programmes under the Convention to Combat Desertification.

Further to the notification dated 18 January 2002 inviting Parties to the Convention to nominate experts in the field of dry and sub-humid lands biological diversity and the notification dated 26 February 2002 conveying the composition of the group of selected experts (Annex I), I am pleased to inform you that the second meeting of the ad hoc technical expert group on dry and sub-humid lands will be held from 23 to 27 September 2002 in the premises of the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity in Montreal, Canada. The same group of experts were notified and will meet for the second and last time. The selection of experts was based on nominations by the Parties and organizations, taking into account the participants' demonstrated expertise and experience in the field of conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity in dryland, Mediterranean, arid, semi-arid, grassland and savannah ecosystems, geographical distribution and gender balance. The experts were selected jointly with the Secretariat of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD).
